## TRIKE debate its SP s

he debate whether or not the skyrocketing fee increases in tricycle operation in Dumaguete be repealed or amended hit a snag on second reading at the City Council Thursday.

The cause was the absence of two councilors, Antonio and Patrimonio, who earlier signified their thrust for the repeal, but they absented themselves during the important debate. They gave the reasons for their absence as "on official business

Some responsible quarters in the city have opined that the issue has now become politicized in that those for repeal would be identified "anti-administration' while those in favor of mere amendment be pro-adminis-

#### HIDDEN AGENDA?
